	Working under the Shepherd's oversight and guidance, he will collaborate with the Shepherds on training and instruction that is needed for the congregation. Instruction will include sermons from the pulpit as well as weekly classes.
Evangelism Planning and Follow-up	As per our motivation and desire to evangelize in our local community, the evangelist will be a catalyst alongside the Shepherds in planning and executing evangelism efforts. Such efforts will culminate in "honest hearts" hearing and receiving the word of God. Our desire is to be "planters of the Word" while God gives the increase (1 Cor 3:6)
